There were no public comments.

Tim is on the nominating committee. He has made several calls to Kris Thrush. Bruce Miller declined for personal reasons. We will get Tim more phone numbers. Alley Park has not returned a signed contract, but the check has been cashed. Don joined the meeting at 5:03 p.m.

Dave gave the NRCS report. Amy, Nikki and Dave completed the second ONE (orientation for new employees) Tour with participants from all over the country. The CSP ranking deadline was last week. There were a dozen renewals all of which are in and 10 new applications with 3-5 to get into the program. New NRCS employee Brice Shaw, (Joe Koehler's old position) Soil Conservationist replacement, starts Monday. He is an OSU grad from Logan. The local workgroup meeting to discuss issues/concerns will be held June 29 at 6 p.m. at the Wolfinger farm to tour their solar pump and composter.

The level 2 budget is due June 22. We are requesting a slight increase in the county appropriation -2% increase in salaries and 8% insurance increase, although insurance may differ if the county changes carriers. The education specialist position was removed. Don made a motion to approve the level 2 budget. Tim seconded. A vote was taken: all in favor. Motion carried.

Amy reviewed the rough draft business plan. After speaking to Travis Markwood from the chamber, we are adding a few more pages. There is no due date, but Amy would like to have it completed by the budget hearing in November.

The pollution complaint at 839 Rock Mill Road involving a horse manure pile in close proximity to a stream was discussed. Four letters have been mailed with multiple deadlines over the last year. Don made a motion to forward the complaint to ODA for Chiefs Orders. Tim seconded. A vote was taken: all in favor. Motion carried.

We are running low on pencils. They are handed out at various educational presentations and events. *Tim made a motion to approve the purchase of 5,000 pencils for \$1,286.78 (estimate) to replenish the supply. Matt seconded. A vote was taken: all in favor.* Motion carried.

Jonathan mentioned that SE Correctional called inquiring about farm rental rates. He contacted other agencies who rent ground. Farm Service Agency gave him program rates based on soils.

The Howard Nickerson family withdrew part of their Farmland Preservation application due to a death and health issues. That money will go back to statewide funds. Three applicants got in including Kircher with 50 acres in Amanda Twp., Reincheld with Greenfield Twp. acreage, and Beyer farm in Richland Twp.

Amy discussed Summer Supervisor School. Matt wants to go to the Monday meetings, and the Board would like to attend the Fairfield County tour on Tuesday.

Tim made a motion to adjourn the Board meeting at 6:01 p.m. Matt seconded. A vote was taken: all in favor.
