Meeting called to order at 2:00pm

-Introductions of all in attendance. Jonathan introduced representatives from Fairfield Co. GIS dept.

1st order of business: motion to approve minutes from 2014 subcommittee meeting.

-Denise made motion, 2nd by Greg

- Greg asked about shopping carts being removed from Hocking R. in Lancaster. Denise stated that several clean-up events had been held along select stretches of the river and resulted in many carts being removed.

-Vote on motion – all in favor – motion passed, minutes accepted

Public Comments

-Bob Maynard – no comments

-Paul Kemmer – Expressed concerns over Fairfield County’s lack of state/federal grant funds regarding storm water and sewage treatment. He encouraged cooperation between county agencies when applying for these funding opportunities. He also would be interested in opening up discussion and public awareness for HSTS inspection protocol for both MS4 and non-MS4 communities.

Review draft-summary of annual themes for education

-Jonathan discussed proposed themes for education and outreach for 2015-2019 based on public input. Long-term management plan due to EPA by December 2016.

- 2015-2019 continue PuP program and goose manure management education through articles, mailings and pledge cards
- 2016 target DIY residents for proper automotive and household fluid disposal as well as outreach to contractor audience.
- 2017 reach 100% of HSTS owners in coordination with Fairfield & Franklin Depts. of Health. Also educate HSTS installation contractors on proper techniques.
- 2018 Homeowners and contract applicators on BMPS for pesticide and fertilizer application
- 2019 Stream litter reduction and pick up. Work with commercial property managers, public groups, Fairfield Litter and Recycling to create recycling/litter pick up events, address “adopt-a-road” sites that are no longer active.

-Kelly mentioned that Fairfield Co. had received \$150,000 in grant funding to repair/replace failing *private* HSTS. Funds must be spent in 2016 and will fund projects based on household income in relation to poverty level. 100% poverty level = 100% paid, 200% PL = 85% paid, 300% PL = 50% paid.

-Jonathan also made reference to County Prosecutor's interpretation of ORC 307.79 that *no exemptions* could be made regarding permit issuance for construction disturbances on sites <1 acre that fall under the county's oversight.

-Betsy mentioned she had been "quizzing" township residents about the location of their HSTS (if applicable) and found out that the overwhelming majority have no clue.

Discussion on appointing new Chair/Co-Chair of subcommittee

-Greg moved to keep the current officers of Jonathan Ferbrache – Chair, Edward Drobina – Co-Chair, 2nd by Scott T., motion passed.

Next meeting

-Tentatively scheduled for some point in June 2016, but final date will be finalized based on member availability and/or if immediate need arises.

Motion to adjourn

-Motion by Denise, 2nd by Kelly, motion passed, meeting adjourned 3:11pm.
